**Course Description**

This course will introduce students to the discipline of socio-cultural anthropology. They will learn how society and culture work to influence and shape peoples' lives. Moreover, this course is an exploration of fundamental anthropological concepts, methods, and theories used to interpret traditional and modern cultures. Emphasis is placed on the socio-cultural practices of the modern era to be able to relate more to the experiences of the students. During this class the students will learn about people's practices locally and globally, both to broaden their understanding of how culture structures and patterns the lives of different groups, and to gain a better understanding of themselves.

**Course Objectives**

During and after completing the course, the students are expected to:

1. define anthropology and describe its distinguishing features, scope, and subject matter
2. define and differentiate the concepts of society and culture
3. explain the concepts of marriage and the family
4. talk about the changes in and current problems of marriage and family systems
5. discuss gender role socialization, gender stereotypes, and stratification
6. explain the influences and effects of social media for humankind and society
7. conduct observations and interviews about specific topics and present the results in class

**Course Language**

*This class is 100% taught in English.* Students will need to have a good level of English to read and understand the contents of the course and to be able to present an assigned topic as well as to participate in class discussions.

**Course Guidelines**

At the beginning of the semester, each student will choose a topic for presentation

A creative presentation is encouraged

The professor will give the students a list of the required assignments for each topic.

Handphone use for dictionaries is allowed and encouraged.

Students should come to class on time and prepared.

Students must act respectfully and courteously in class at all times.

### **Required Text/Material**

There is no specific textbook for this course. Reading/video materials including handouts and worksheets will be provided accordingly. The students are free to use any valid source of information either online or printed for their topics.

Attend and participate actively in all general class sessions.

Make all assigned presentations.

### **Policies**
