Course Description

This course will introduce students to the different cultures of the world to widen their perspective that is important in understanding people in a multicultural society. The students will have the chance to explore why people from different parts of the world behave and act differently through readings, video presentations, and class interactions. This will enable students to recognize their own distinct culture and in effect respect the differences that exist between and among people in the world. Issues and concerns on cultures that affect society will be further discussed. Emphasis on the development of students' English communicative skills: listening, reading, writing, and speaking will be given importance.

Course Objectives

During the entire course, the students are expected to:

- 2. participate in class discussions by giving opinions and ideas and sharing experiences
- 3. present creatively and thoroughly an assigned topic
- 4. analyze the similarities and differences of the different cultures discussed

5. use English language with confidence all throughout class presentations, discussions and interactions

Course Language

This class is 100% taught in English. Students will need to have a good level of English to read and understand the contents of the course and to be able to present an assigned topic as well as to participate in class discussions.

Course Guidelines

- At the beginning of the semester, each student will choose a topic for presentation.
- A creative presentation is encouraged.
- The professor will give the students a list of the required assignments for each topic.
- Handphone use for dictionaries is allowed and encouraged.
- Students should come to class on time and prepared.
- Students must act respectfully and courteously in class at all times.

Required Text/Material

There is no specific textbook for this course. Reading/video materials including handouts and worksheets will be provided accordingly. The students are free to use any valid source of information either online or printed for their topics.

Expectations

- Attend and participate actively in all general class sessions.
- Complete all required activities and any related assignments.
- Make all assigned presentations.

Policies

To complete a course, students must attend at least 75% of classes. If students miss a course more than four times, they will fail the course.
