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### Course introduction

This course is designed as an introduction to the French language and culture of countries where the language is spoken. The course will consist of lectures, videos, songs and recordings, photographs and other media objects, group work, activities, individual project, group project, homework, and exams.

### Course objectives

After completing the course, students will;

- have an understanding of basic French
- be able to count numbers, identify colors and use basic phrases
- be able to give basic descriptions of people places and things
- have developed a basic understanding of the cultures of French speaking countries
- have a foundation to proceed to more advanced French language courses

### Course language

***This course is taught in English and French.*** Students will need to have a good level of English to read and understand the contents and to complete the assignments.
