Course introduction

This course is designed as an introduction to the Spanish language and to provide students with a basic foundation to prepare for the Diplomas of Spanish as a Foreign Language (DELE). This course will consist of lectures, videos, songs and recordings, photographs and other media objects, group work, activities, individual projects, group projects, homework, and exams.

Course objectives

- be able to count numbers, identify colors and use basic phrases
- be able to give basic descriptions of people places and things
- have developed a basic understanding of the cultures of Spanish-speaking countries
- have a foundation to proceed to more advanced Spanish language courses

Course language

This course is taught in English and Spanish. Students will need a decent level of English to read and understand the contents and to complete the assignments.
