Course introduction

This course is designed for students who have not previous knowledge of the Italian language. The goal of this course is to form a basic knowledge of the Italian language and to prepare the students for the Italian examination test: *Certificato di Conoscenza della Lingua Italiana* CELI, level 1. This course consists of lectures, videos, songs and recordings, photographs and other media objects, group work, activities, individual projects, group projects, homework, and exams.

Course objectives

After completing the course, students will:

- have a basic understanding of Italian;
 - be able to use basic phrases in a communication;
 - be able to read, write and understand an Italian speaker at basic level;
 - be able to give descriptions of people, places, things and everyday situations;
 - have a good understanding of the Italian culture;
 - be able to take the exam for the Diplomas of Italian as foreign language level 1.

Course language

<u>This course is taught in English</u>. Students need a good level of English and must have successfully passed all the compulsory ESL classes offered by the University of Suwon. The lack of any of the two requirements stated above cannot guarantee a positive result for this course. This course is intensive and it is recommended for those students who have an interest of learning the Italian language for working or academic reasons.
